Phantom Wallet is a popular non-custodial crypto wallet for Solana, Ethereum, and Polygon, but many users wonder whether disputes are possible when a blockchain transaction goes wrong. The short answer is that blockchain transactions are irreversible by design, and Phantom itself does not have the authority to reverse or "charge back" transfers the way banks can. If you believe you were scammed or compromised, your primary steps should be to secure your wallet immediately, move remaining assets to a new wallet, and revoke any risky token approvals. Additionally, you can report incidents to law enforcement cybercrime units and blockchain investigation services. The best protection is prevention: double-check recipient addresses, review transaction details carefully, avoid suspicious links, and never share your private keys or seed phrase.
